Guidelines for composing the Lab Books in 2019

- Compose a chapter for each practice. There's no need of any abstract, introduction or motivation sections. This is about a laboratory book which records and documents your personal results and is not to be published anyhow.
- I will assess your LabBooks on the basis of their thoroughness, clarity and their exhaustiveness
- Altogether, the document layout must be clear, consistent and tidy
- Please, copy each original problem statement from the practice scripts and thereafter compose your solution
- Explain the main results obtained in each exercise, preferably in English. Write about the essential aspects of the exercise at hand. You don't need to write much, but your writing should sharp. Follow these guidelines:
 - Each paragraph should convey a single idea.
 - Screen dumps, diagrams, listings and tables must be captioned and indexed
 - Remark the difficulties you found and how you resolved them
 - Cite the references that you have consulted, either in Internet or elsewhere
 - Avoid copying materials directly from Internet except when necessary, and always reference the sources, credit the authors
 - The greatest value of your work stems from your own thinking, your observations and your conclusions!
- Your work must be original and present the results that you obtained in the Lab sessions. Screen dumps may be shared by a few students, however, the pictures or other multimedia elements must relevant to the practice and must be properly interpreted
- Include a section of references if necessary
- Please, submit a <u>single pdf file</u> or, if the resulting size is too big for the email system, upload it to your DropBox or Google Drive account, then, make the document public and provide me the URL in your e-mail message. If compressing is necessary, please do so in <u>zip format, only!</u>

- The file name should have the following structure:
 <course>-<Your ID>.pdf or .zip if that is the case where
 course:= CN | DS | TEL | NGN depending on the specific course
 your attending. Example: CN-09876543A.zip
